

# Fishing Report 19th April 2021

A sunny but cool week of weather has presented more of a challenge to some of our anglers, with many finding success in the warmer shallows close in to the banks.

We've again hosted 2 matches this week, one for the Foremarke Fly Fishers which saw 10 anglers catch a total of 31 fish, with the winner Martin chalking up an impressive 12 catches. The second match was between the St Oswald Lodge and Fly Fishers Lodge - a write up of which is below has been kindly supplied by Tony Higton below:

Both Lodges enjoyed a very pleasant day out on the water on Thursday 14th with 24 Anglers taking part and a total of 41 trout caught during the competition. The weather was very kind to us and despite a cold wind and cold water temperatures, which tended to put the fish down, a lot of fish were caught by anglers fishing close to the banks in the warmer water.

The competition was well and truly won by Flyfishers' Lodge with a total 'Team Weight' of 69lbs - 3oz and are now the holders of the 'St Oswald Plate'. St Oswald Lodge had a total 'Team Weight' of 30lbs - 14oz. The biggest fish of the day was a 5lbs 4 oz Rainbow Trout caught by David Marriott near Shiningford Creak. His name will now be engraved on the 'Dave Bowen Memorial Plate'. Well done David.

The Boat Pair with the highest bag weight, (fishing for the St Oswald Lodge team) was Mark Lee and Pete Eville who caught their bag limit of 8 fish to a total weight of 16lbs 15oz. Well done to Mark and Pete.

The rod average for this week was **3.58** with 279 fish caught by 78 anglers.

## **Best Rainbow/Brown**

The heaviest Rainbow was 5lb 4oz caught by Frank Sumnall.

The heaviest Brown was 4lb 8oz caught by Mr Scholes.

## **Methods & Flies**

Fish have been caught using intermediate or sinking lines with a slow retrieve.

The most successful flies were buzzers, boobies, minkies, black snakes and green and black lures.

#### **Top Spot**

The most popular spots have been Shiningford Creek, Millfields and drifting between the watersports and sailing club islands.


# How to make a booking for Carsington Water

The best way to make a booking is via our new website: www.carsingtonwater.com We have two time options for booking a boat, 8.30 - 17.30 or 9.00 - 18.00.

If you have purchased multiple permits from us at the beginning of the season then please just book your boat and follow the instructions on the booking page.

Derbyshire County Angling Club - DCAC customers also have the same two time options.

### **Boundary Reminder**

With the start of the new season here's a reminder of the fishing areas we often refer to, including the 'no fish' areas shown hatched in red.

We have also added a line of buoys across the sailing club bay. Please do not fish past any white or yellow buoyed areas.

If you are unsure of anything before going out please ask a member of staff who will be happy to help.
