

Fishing Report - Monday 5th August 2024

There has been very little change this week apart from water temperatures increasing a little and pushing the fish down a few extra feet. Buoys 10,11 and 4 seem to be holding fish but are much deeper than the previous week. Di6, Di7 and Di8 lines are being used rather than intermediate or slow sinking lines.

Pink or white snakes have been catching the most fish on a slow sinking retrieve with the odd quicker pull on the line to change the motion of the fly and attract the fish.

It's been a mixed week of weather once again with the cloudier, cooler days probably being more lucrative.

Our regular anglers on Monday and Tuesday were seen to catch 3 and 4's mostly using snakes as suggested by Terry.

The hot, still conditions during the middle of the week certainly pushed the fish down deep and slower sinking lines were needed.

Catch results picked up again over the weekend as we experienced a little more cloud cover and a little rain keeping water temperatures increasing more.

All anglers have been fishing the middle of the water and drifting those deeper areas.

Looking ahead, the weather forecast is showing cooler temperature around 18-20 degrees however the winds are due to increase as the week goes on with gusty conditions forecast Wednesday through to Friday.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was 2.1 with 46 fish caught by 21 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

Dennis Tidmarol caught 4lb rainbows which were our heaviest fish of the week.

Methods & Flies

This week has mostly seen the use of Slow Sinking (Di6, 7 & 8) lines. We have seen the use of pink or white snakes, buzzers and daddies have all worked well.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been, Fishtail creek, Dam Wall, Buoys 10 & 11 & 4 and the middle of the water.

Predator Fishing

Following the success of our predator fishing days held at the end of last season we will be offering a number of days at the end of the 2024 season. We had excellent reports with regards to the resident perch with some large specimens being caught. The reports regarding pike were less promising but many visiting anglers feel they experienced follows, pulls and breaks from what could quite possibly have been pike.

There will be 8 days in all with limited number of boats each day so book your tickets to guarantee your visit.
