

Fishing Report - Monday 29th April 2024

At last we are experiencing some warmer weather and the rod average has increased a little to 4.84. There has been a mixture of wind conditions from strong North easterlies to calmer southerly and westerly conditions. This has certainly moved the natural food source all around the water. Fishtail Creek and Upperfields Bay have improved as the fish have begun to move away from the banks and out into the deeper water.

Wednesday was an excellent day with many of our regular anglers catching double figures, Nigel and Lester managed 33 to the boat on floating lines, buzzers and nymphs.

Friday and Saturday brought a similar day with many anglers fishing on buzzers, olive patterns or nymphs using floating or intermediate lines and stripping them back through the water. Phil Harding caught our largest rainbow of the week, an overwinter fish weighing 5lbs 3oz caught in Fishtail Creek using a buzzer. See picture below.

We didn't have any anglers out on Sunday despite the great weather conditions.

This week we begin our evening fishing sessions where fishing will be available until 8pm. We currently have 1 boat left for this Wednesday and plenty for next Thursday 16th May which will be our next evening session. More dates are advertised on our website and below.
