



Fishing Report - Monday 8th July 2024

The warmer temperatures during mid week have certainly produced some favourable fishing conditions helping bring the rod average up to 4.89.

The general increase in air and water temperatures have seen an increased use of floating lines, hoppers & daddies and a number of boats drifting across the main basin.

Unfortunately, the high winds on Thursday put paid to this and significantly reduced the number of anglers to the water for the rest of the week.

Tuesday saw many regular anglers taking advantage of the weather. Several anglers took the decision to fish slow sinking lines and drifted using their rudder whilst other practiced floating line techniques ahead for Wednesday's competition. Both methods produced successful results.

Wednesday, we played host to a regional police competition with 10 boats taking to the water in a floating line only competition. 20 anglers fished catching 96 fish between them. Together with their floating lines the most favourable flies were cormorants, blobs, boobies, daddies and hoppers. It was great to hear that the floating line method had worked so well, and that fish were being caught much closer to the surface and also out from the banks.

A quiet weekend with only one boat angler taking advantage of the whole of the water, visiting us whilst on holiday. He had a great afternoon catching a few fish and loosing many others.

We are hoping to see the return of some warmer, calmer weather this week.

This week's late night fishing is on Wednesday 10th July. Our final late fishing session will be the following week Thursday 18th July.

Methods & Flies

This week has mostly seen the use of slow sinking lines or floating lines

With an increase in air temperature, we have seen the use of hoppers and daddies plus cormorants, blobs, boobies and purple or pink snakes have all worked well.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been, the Fishtail creek, Upperfields Bay, Buoys 3, 4 & 10 and the middle of the water.
