



Fishing Report - Monday 29th July 2024

A huge mixture of fishing conditions once again this week.

Midweek on Wednesday seeing very few fish caught during the warm, bright conditions followed by Thursday being overcast and producing a catch rate of 18 fish for some anglers.

It seems like the fish have certainly gone deeper in the water with sinking lines (Di3) and intermediate lines catching the majority of the fish this week.

The Dam wall and the middle of the reservoir are producing some good catches, especially around buoys 10& 11.

Pink Snakes have been the most lucrative fly producing bags of 18 fish and more.
Dry's have also been popular on the overcast, slightly cooler days with daddies showing success.

Tuesday, despite being bright, kept the catch result inline with the current rod average and many anglers caught their full 4 fish bag limit.

Wednesday, despite a lovely day out on the water, the fish were deep with the bright conditions and catch rate was a little lower.

Thursday and Friday saw overcast conditions and some incredible catch rates for this point in the season. Many fish were caught using snakes and slow sinking lines.

The weekend brought us a mix of weather. The light breeze seemed to help conditions on Sunday with some anglers catching 10 to the boat. Once again pink snakes being the preferred option.

Looking ahead, the weather forecast is showing very warm conditions for the first part of the week with some breeze. Towards the end of the week, it looks like temperatures will reduce a little, still staying bright with a moderate breeze.

Rod Average

The rod average for this week was 2.3 with 70 fish caught by 30 anglers.

Best Rainbow/Brown

Mr Tidmarsh and Mr Udell both caught 4lb rainbows which were our heaviest fish of the week.

Methods & Flies

This week has mostly seen the use of Slow Sinking (Di3) lines or Intermediate lines.
We have seen the use of pink snakes, buzzers, red snakes, black nymphs and daddies have all worked well.

Top Spot

The most popular spots have been, Dam Wall, Buoys 10 & 11 and the middle of the water.

Predator Fishing

Following the success of our predator fishing days held at the end of last season we will be offering a number of days at the end of the 2024 season. We had excellent reports with regards to the resident perch with some large specimens being caught. The reports regarding pike were less promising but many visiting anglers feel they experienced follows, pulls and breaks from what could quite possibly have been pike.

There will be 8 days in all with limited number of boats each day so book your tickets to guarantee your visit.
