



## Fishing Report - Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2024

A slightly quieter week this week and a mixture of cool, breezy weather at the beginning of the week followed by warmer conditions over the weekend.

The fish are certainly spreading out across the water noted by anglers moving frequently and recording catches from several different locations during their visit. We are seeing more fish closer to the surface and moving away for the margins. The great news is the increased use of dry flies so certainly worth ago on your next visit if condition allow.

Jon Smith and Tim Grove visited us at the beginning of the week for an enjoyable 3 days, they persevered with dry flies and caught a number of fish on daddies. Jon caught a number of 4lb plus fish from around the Tower bank area. Wednesday's fishing took a little more effort pulling lures on a fast retrieve to attract a great sized fish.

The weekend brought a few more anglers to the water following the Bank holiday week. The calmer, slightly warmer conditions on Saturday seemed to bring the fish closer to the surface. A number of anglers caught on floating lines with buzzers, fishtail creek and Millfields proved popular spots.

Despite the warm bright weather on Sunday the fish were certainly there to be caught. Ben Bayliss and Adam Larbalestier fished Brown Ale Bay. Ben had 15 fish on buzzer, diawlback and snakes, Adam started out fishing nymphs but changed to snakes and successfully caught 11 fish. Completing their catch returns with 'Awesome Day'

Keith and Mr Hockenhall also had great success with 28 fish between them. They fished the opposite bank on the east side of the water. Diawlback, blobs and cormorants worked on well on a washing line of flies, an excellent day was had by both. The average weight of fish being 2.5lbs.

### Best Rainbow/Brown

Jon Smith had several days fishing with us last week and caught both of our heaviest rainbows at 4lbs 8oz. Both were caught near Tower bank, Tuesday the preferred method was dries and on Wednesday lures on a fast retrieved worked better.

### Methods & Flies

Intermediate and floating lines have been the order of the week. A washing line of flies either buzzers, nymphs or diawlbachs have worked well.

The most successful flies were nymphs, buzzers, daddies, mayfly, diawlbach Tequila / FAB Blob and Booby, cormorant, snakes.

### Top Spot

The most popular spots have been, Middlewood, Tower bank, Brown ale bay, Fishtail creek, Halfmoon field, Millfields and Upperfield bay.
